

Preview the Spring Plant Sale

Plants of North American native origin are plants that are, in some cases, an improvement of the species. For example, Monarda didyma or bee balm has become a disappointment in the landscape. The old standard bee balm has two strikes against it. First, the plant runs and takes over a large area. Secondly, it's prone to powdery mildew. The southeastern region is hot and humid where the mildew thrives. Yes, these factors have control measures but a lot of today's gardeners are looking for low maintenance. Thankfully, the market is now filled with plants that may be dwarf, will not spread and are powdery mildew resistant. I call that a win, win. At the plant sale, one can find a purple and a hot pink variety.

Monarda 'Balmy Lilac' has more pink tones than lilac. The blossoms come with the same richness of nectar and with the abundance of blooms to attract many pollinators. The other is Monarda 'Balmy Purple', both from a new series, called...Balmy!! 'Balmy Purple' bee balm has rich, raspberry purple flowers. The Balmy Series will reach 2' x 2' when mature and will flower for several weeks from late spring through summer. Something to keep in mind is not all plants behave the same.



Powdery mildew could still occur if plants are crowded or planted with not enough sun. Also, really rich soils will make the plants happy, too happy if you know what I mean. They like full sun, good drainage and are not fussy about soils.

You can also find two shrubs on the plant sale list that are of North American native origin with smaller habits compared to the species. For those who have downsized or are looking for container plants, look at the new dwarf Fothergilla, Legend of the Small® bottlebrush and one that's been around awhile, Hydrangea quercifolia 'Munchkin' oakleaf hydrangea.




Legend of the Small® bottlebrush still possesses the same bright white flowers, the blue-green leaves in summer followed by amazing orangered fall color. 'Munchkin' hydrangea was discovered as a dwarf seedling. After years of trialing, this dwarf hydrangea has matured to 3' tall and wide'. The cone-shaped heads produce white florets that turn a light cinnamon brown until winter. In fall, the leaves turn red offering one last hoorah. As a bonus, the twigs exfoliate and show off reddish bark and branches.

Another plug for the plant sale is a northern popular plant that make southerners jealous. It's a lilac that is ideal for the southeast, Syringa 'SMNSKTP' or Baby Kim™ lilac. It's another plant made for smaller gardens. Baby Kim™ gets 3' x 3' and has an explosion of blooms. The cone-shaped inflorescence produces purple buds that open pale purple and is super fragrant. It is maintenance free, grows best in full sun and supposedly, deer resistant.







Magnolia figo, or banana shrub has pale yellow flowers that smell like ripe bananas and Magnolia figo ssp. crassipes, a raspberry-purple flowering form. Now, you get the same fruity fragrance on a purple flowering banana shrub. The flowers are also much larger in size too.

In year's past, the crowds arrive early with nearly a sellout in the first two hours. Don't wait, come early and afterwards, enjoy the gardens while you are here. In some cases, plants can be ordered if they sell out. Also, the remaining plants will be available for purchase for one more week during Gift Shop Hours (April 15-19). All proceeds benefit the future development of the Garden.

April Plant of the Month

Narcissus 'Maria Gertrude' -cyclamineus daffodil



The spring season has arrived a little early this year making in the second time in 16 years. Daffodils are a much better bulb to grow in the south as they return with the same vigor and quality as their first year. There are over 10,000 varieties making up 13 divisions, miniatures and species, all ranging in colors of salmon, orange, yellow and white. Another draw is they are deer and critter resistant. Deer, squirrels and voles do not like the bulbs as they possess crystals that are toxic. Narcissus gets their name from the Greek word narco, or narcotic as describing the toxicity. They

also get their name from a young man in Greek mythology that bowed his head down to look at his reflection in a nearby stream.

From our good friends, Brent and Becky's Bulbs brings many new varieties of tulips and daffodils this year. April's plant of the month is Narcissus 'Maria Gertrude' a cyclaminues daffodil. The cyclamineus division are daffodils where the flower petals that reflex away from the cup. 'Maria Gertrude' has bright golden yellow petals that bend backwards allowing the vibrant orange cup to shine. It's an early to midspring season performer that will last for up to 2 weeks in ideal conditions. Because they bloom before leaves emerge from the trees, it's a great choice for some shade or full sun. Expect 'Maria Gertrude' to get 12" tall.



The World Up Close: Digital Macro Photography

Learn to take compelling macro photographs, with flora and fauna of the Garden as your subject. Students need to know basic operation of their cameras (how to adjust your settings, use of aperture and shutter). We will get up close and personal in the Garden from the tiniest of insects to water droplets on a petal. We will discuss essential equipment, basic techniques and controlling depth-of-field and what makes a macro photograph better. A DSLR camera with manual settings is needed with a macro lens (your own or rented) or extension tubes for one of your other lenses, diopter or even a telephoto lens. A tripod or monopod and external flash are recommended for macro photography. Beginner and intermediate photographers welcome. In the event of inclement weather, a makeup class will be held on June 25 from 5:30pm - 8:30pm.
