

How to make Tulip & Daffodil Lights from recycled plastic bottles



STEP 1: Gather 16 oz. water, soda and 1 liter bottles, remove labels and clean -save caps. Cut bottles in half, taking that cut side and making 3 scallops...petals.

2 bottoms make 1 flower, 2 tops make one flower. One bottom will get inserted into the other, overlapping the petals. Remove the mouthpiece from 1 of the 2 tops and insert the cut mouth over the uncut mouth overlapping the petals

STEP 2: Place in a protected area to spray paint any color of your choosing. If you want to mix and match, paint insides one color and outsides another, or paint solid colors, or take a brush and create eyelashes on the rims of a different color



STEP 3: To get the crinkled look, hold the bottle over a flame to melt just enough to disfigure the edge.



STEP 4: Use a soldering iron to melt a hole in the bottoms and use a blade to make a criss-cross on the caps. Also, melt smaller holes at the bottom of the flower for drainage.

STEP 5: Using tape or glue, adhere the lights onto bamboo stakes and insert the bottle over the light either through the cap or through the hole at the bottom
